## Report on English Orientation Workshop – SVVK High School Staff



An English Orientation Workshop was conducted at SVVD on 26.07.2025 for high school English teachers, focusing on enhancing exam-oriented teaching strategies for X std students. Mr. Prabhakaran from Thiruvavarur District served as the Chief Guest, offering detailed guidance on question-wise approaches, grammar instruction, poetic devices, and writing skills.



Key takeaways included the use of visual techniques for synonyms/antonyms, importance of teaching grammar contextually, structured methods for poetry analysis, and reinforcing comprehension and writing tasks. Teachers were encouraged to use PTA guides, government papers, and practical worksheets to improve application-based learning. The session concluded with a Vote of Thanks by Ms. Kala (ACO, SVVD) and Mr. Anantha Raman (SVVK).

## Notebook Inspection: Strengthening Academic Discipline

As part of our commitment to academic excellence and consistent learning habits, our school conducted a Notebook Inspection for students of Grades VI to VIII from 28/7/25 to 30/7/25. The inspection was carried out by a team of Higher Secondary teachers, who reviewed notebooks across subjects to ensure quality, completeness, and presentation. This initiative aimed to reinforce the importance of regular class work writing, encourage neatness and subject wise content. It also helped to identify areas where students need

support. The inspecting teachers provided constructive remarks and praised some students for their efforts. They also emphasized the role of notebooks as a reflection of learning and a valuable revision tool. Students became more aware of presentation standards and handwriting discipline.

The subject teachers will continue to monitor notebooks and offer guidance where needed. The inspection fostered a sense of accountability among the subject handling staff, and we look forward to continued collaboration in nurturing strong academic habits across all section of VI to VIII.

## Exploring Beyond the Classroom: Field Trip to D.Mart, Jain Temple and Aluminum Factory

On 28/7/25 students of Grade I and II embarked on an exciting and educational field trip to Jain Temple. On 29/7/25 Grade III to V went to D. Mart. On 31/7/25 VI to VIII ( Boys) visited an Aluminum Factory and VI to VIII (Girls) went to D. Mart. These field trips were organized by our school to enrich classroom learning through real-world experiences.

The visit to temples helped our students appreciate cultural heritage, architectural styles, and the role of spirituality in community life.



Aluminum Factory visit exposed our students of VII to industrial processes, metallurgy, and safety protocols. It reinforced science concepts like electrolysis and sustainability while offering insight into career paths in manufacturing and engineering.

These trips were designed to complement the curriculum in subjects like Science, Math and Social Studies offering students a hands-on understanding of concepts they've studied in class. It also aimed to foster curiosity, teamwork, and observational skills. It sparked interest in future careers and community involvement.

## Doctors' Day Celebration :

Honouring Our Real-Life Heroes. In India Doctor's Day is observed on the 1st of July to mark the importance of doctors hold in our lives.

On the occasion of National Doctors' Day, on July 1, in celebration of health awareness and student well-being, our school hosted a free Eye Testing Camp conducted by a dedicated team of ophthalmologists from Aravind Eye Hospital. The initiative aimed to promote early detection of vision issues and educate students on the importance of eye care. Over 526 students from classes VI to VIII underwent professional eye screening. The medical team used advanced tools such as eye charts, refractometers, and ophthalmoscopes to assess visual acuity and detect refractive errors. Students identified with vision concerns were provided with personalized advice and in some cases, prescriptions for corrective lenses. Students learned about eye hygiene, screen-time management, and the role of nutrition in maintaining healthy eyesight. The camp encouraged students to take ownership of their health and understand how vision affects learning and concentration.

We extend our heartfelt thanks to the visiting ophthalmologists for their time, expertise, and compassion. Their presence not only helped identify hidden vision issues but also reinforced our commitment to holistic student development.



## Phonics Class Observation – Building Strong Foundations in Literacy!

We believe in nurturing strong language skills from an early age. As part of our academic observation program, a Phonics Class Observation was conducted in the Pre- Primary Grades this week.

Our young learners enthusiastically participated in engaging phonics-based activities, demonstrating their understanding of letter sounds, blending, segmenting, and word building. The observation highlighted the effectiveness of our systematic phonics instruction, where children practised:

- Sound recognition using flashcards
- Blending sounds to read simple words
- Word games and rhyming activities
- Phonics songs
- Writing CVC (consonant-vowel-consonant) words

The teachers used interactive teaching aids, phonics charts, and smart board visuals to make learning both fun and meaningful. The observers appreciated the students' enthusiasm, clarity of speech, and growing confidence in reading and spelling.

Our Students were able to identify sounds and decode words independently. Active participation through games and storytelling enhanced sound retention. Teachers used differentiated instruction to support all learners.

We are proud of our learners and commend our dedicated educators for creating a joyful and literacy-rich environment. These foundational skills are crucial for future reading and writing success!
