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FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Dear parents,

It is always a fine balance between ensuring that parents receive the right information at the right time and not overburdening you with too much information.

We take really a strong approach to attendance in school and we ask that you commit yourself, to not taking your children out of school during school hours for holidays, medical appointments, functions or temple visit. When your child cannot come to school, please contact the school office by 8.30 am without delay.

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We need to know that your child is safe, even if from they are absent from school. If there is no reason given for your child's absence, this will be an unauthenticated absence. Children who arrive late between 9.00 am and 9.10am ought to sign in at the office, they will be marked as late and receive a L code. Absence after close of register (9.00am) are an unauthorized. Please note that the children should be in class ready to learn at 8.55 am.

The school gates are closed at 9.00am.

All pupil arriving after 9.00am must register at the school office without fail. Students who attend school every day in a year are almost twice as likely as the rest to reach the expected standard in reading, writing and Maths. In other words, missing just 10 extra days, a year reduces the likelihood of achieving the expected standard in reading, writing and Maths.

Report on Maths Orientation Program – 04.10.2025

A Maths Orientation Program was conducted on 04/10/25 for the high school staff, handled by Mr. Ramesh. The guest elaborated on Chapters 1 to 8, highlighting their significance in the board examination. The session focused on common errors made by students in 2-mark and 5-mark questions and strategies to help them avoid these mistakes. Mr. Ramesh also shared practical tips for supporting slow learners to achieve scores above 60 marks. Additionally, he emphasized the importance of effective time management in both teaching and exam preparation.

The session was informative and provided valuable insights to enhance teaching methods and student performance in the upcoming board exams.

Report on English Orientation Programme – 04.10.2025

An English Orientation Programme for Centum Aspiring Students of SVVK - X students was conducted on 04/10/25 by the guest Mr. Prabhakaran from Thiruvarur District. The session was highly informative and motivational, focusing on strategic preparation for the board examination.

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He explained the marking scheme in detail and discussed common evaluation errors, emphasizing that half marks should not be awarded. Clear guidance was given on framing answers, maintaining tense consistency, and writing effective prose, poem, and supplementary paragraphs with suitable introductions and conclusions.

Report on Science I Orientation Programme – 03.10.2025

A Science I Orientation Programme was conducted on 03/10/25 (Friday) at SVVD by Mr. Sathish Kumar, BT Assistant. The session was held from 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. attended by Science I staff along with top-performing students of Class X.

The programme focused on effective strategies to help students achieve centum in the board examination. The guest explained easy methods for solving numerical and pH problems, provided tips on time management, and emphasized the importance of neat presentation and identifying common mistakes.

He also simplified key concepts such as the Doppler Effect and IUPAC rules, and shared insights through topper answer script analysis. Emphasis was placed on the accurate preparation of one-mark and reasoning questions. Additionally, unit-wise problem materials were distributed to teachers to strengthen student preparation.
